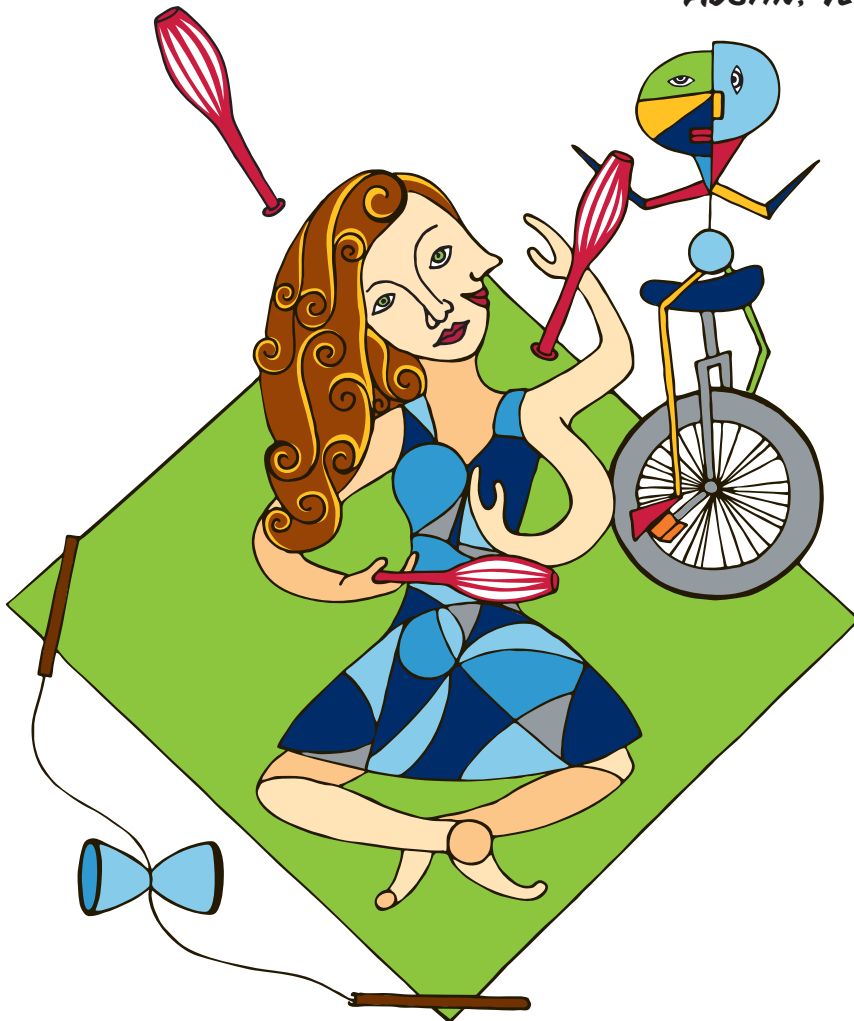
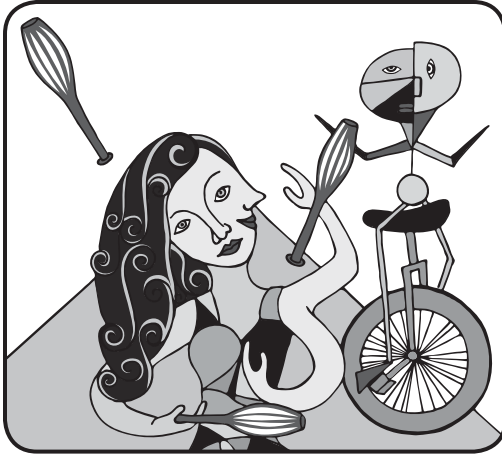

Jugglefest 2011!

This 18th annual Jugglefest is hosted by Texas Juggling Society, a nonprofit organization that fosters the teaching, practice, and appreciation of juggling and related arts. Our mission: to provide a **weekly meeting** where jugglers hone their skills and meet like-minded people; to give **guidance and encouragement** to those ready to learn; and to periodically **exhibit our skills to the community** for general appreciation and social therapy.

First organized in April 1994, Jugglefest is now a three-day event drawing hundreds of jugglers, unicyclists, object manipulators, and spectators from all over.

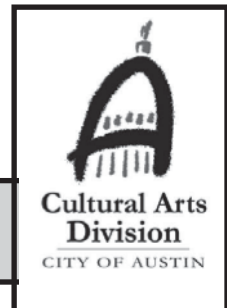
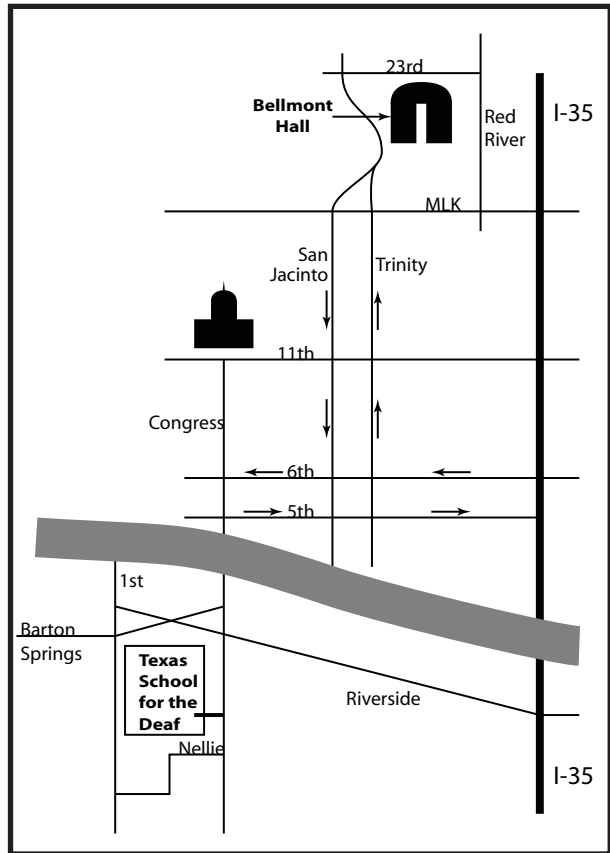

Driving directions to the Texas School for the Deaf, Davis Auditorium

1. From UT, go south on San Jacinto approximately 1 mile. Turn right (east) on 11th Street.
2. Go two blocks to Congress Avenue. Turn left.
3. Go 1.4 miles south on Congress, crossing the Colorado River and Riverside Drive. The Texas School For the Deaf is on your right. If you reach a street called Nellie, you have gone too far.
4. The guard at the gate will direct you to **Davis Auditorium**. Enjoy ample **free parking!**

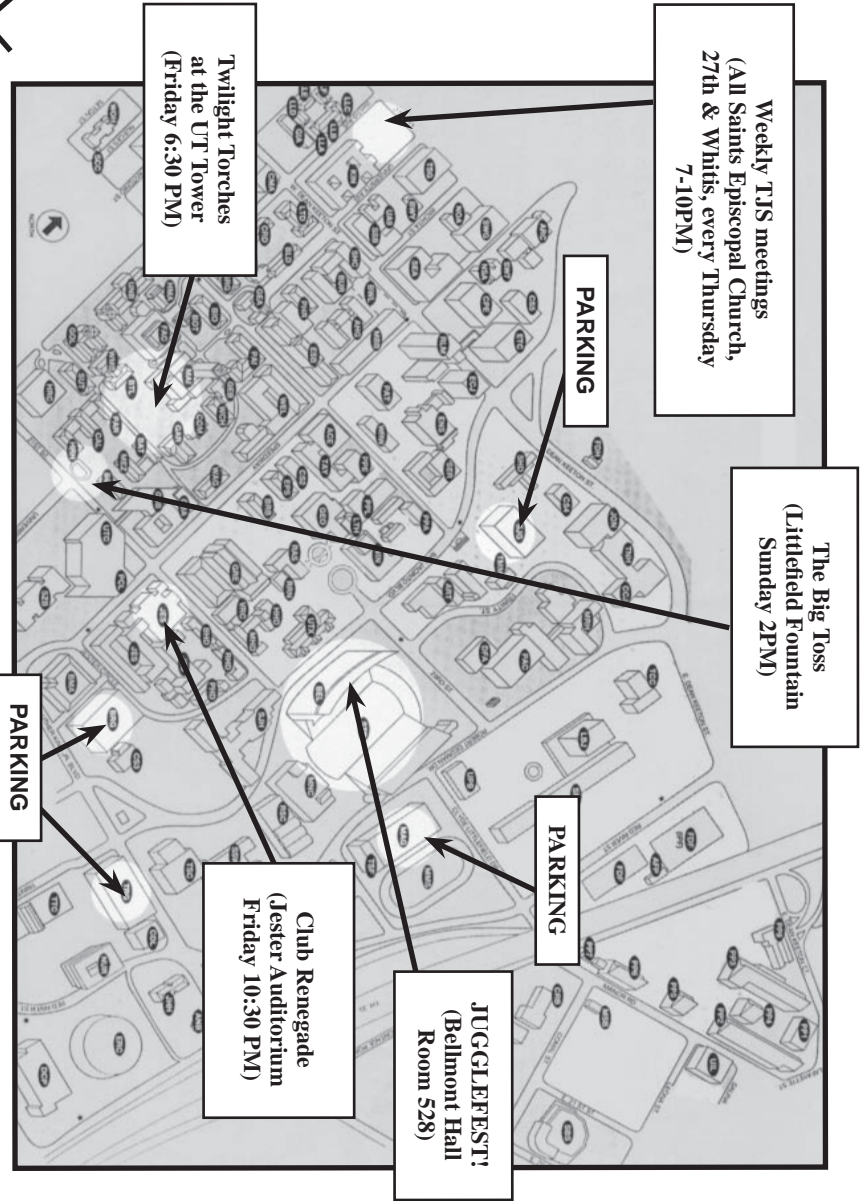

Friday, Feb. 25

6:30PM - Twilight Torches at the UT Tower

All Jugglefest attendees are invited to bring their torches and other ignitable props to the heart of the 40 Acres for a supervised fire session in front of UT's famous bell tower (*see map, previous page*). Couldn't get your torches past security? Not to worry—we have plenty to share. Grab some dinner and get back to Belmont for the 8:30PM door prize drawing.

8:30PM - Door Prize Drawing

9:00PM - Coin Juggling

Individuals juggle three or more coins of at least 75 cents total face value. When you drop, you must drop all your coins on the ground. The winner gets to keep all the coins, but must also pick them up. Additional coin juggling events will be held on Saturday and Sunday if time (and budget!) permit.

10:30PM - CLUB RENEGADE - Jester Auditorium

Admission: FREE! This informal indoor venue features acts that may or may not be ready for prime time. **If you'd like to perform, sign up before the show.** After Jugglefest closes Friday night, just follow the crowd, or see the UT map on the previous page.

NOTE: Adult content. May not be suitable for children.

Saturday, Feb. 26

Noon - Four-Club and Five-Ball Endurance

Juggle longer than everyone else. Everyone starts at the same time. When you drop, you're out. The last juggler standing is the winner. No multiplexing!

Four-Club Endurance is the first event. **Five-Ball Endurance** follows. Both are for individuals.

1:00PM - Speed Passing and Team Seven-Club Endurance

Speed Passing: Teams of two jugglers each pass six clubs as fast as they can. There are two heats of one minute each. The average score of the two heats determines the winners. Ties are broken first by the best heat score, second by a tiebreaker heat. A counter assigned to each team counts the passes in each heat, counting all passes from one hand on the team. The team may choose which hand. Any non-multiplexing pattern is allowed, but both jugglers must be doing the same thing, and the team must be juggling exactly six clubs for anything to count. If a team drops, they may pick up and continue, but teams will not be allowed extra clubs for pick-ups.

Seven Club Endurance: Teams of two jugglers pass seven clubs. Double or single spins allowed. When you drop, you're out. Last team juggling wins.

3:00PM - Door Prize Drawing

3:30PM - Coin Juggling: Double or Nothing!

Didn't win the first Coin Juggling match on Friday? Now's your chance for redemption in this potentially high-stakes juggling smackdown. The winner of Friday's contest will be allowed to compete, but only if he or she puts it all on the line. **Winner takes all.**

4:00PM - Campus Uni Ride

Meet **in front of Bellmont** immediately following the Coin Juggling contest for a leisurely one-wheel ride around campus (weather permitting). Bring your own unicycle.

7:30PM - PUBLIC SHOW

Texas School for the Deaf - Davis Auditorium (*details & map on page 3*).

10:00AM - Muni Ride, Walnut Creek

Mountain unicycling at Walnut Creek Municipal Park. Meet in the parking lot by the pool. Call Ronnie Schaefer for details: (512) 225-4993.

11:00AM - Unicycle Maneuvering

Go to **Bellmont 302** (Uni Central) for this timed competition of one-wheeled slalom, twists, and turns.

Noon - Door Prize Drawing

2:00PM - THE BIG TOSS

Grab your props and follow the leader up 21st Street to the **Littlefield Fountain** (*see UT map, page 6*) for this traditional photo opportunity. Photographers, take your places. Jugglers, on the count of three, toss your props high into the air. Click. Then DUCK!

2:30PM - Diabolo Challenge

Immediately following the Big Toss, come back to the gym for a diabolical challenge for diaboloists. Bring your own diabolo and sticks.

3:30PM - Club Gathering Competition

Catch and hold as many clubs as you can, as thrown by Gamesmeister, Jerry Peterson. He will throw double spins at a constant rate to each competitor. The one who holds the most clubs without dropping wins.

4:00PM - Silent Auction Closes

Last chance to bid (*see box at right*).

6:00PM - "Quittin' Time!"

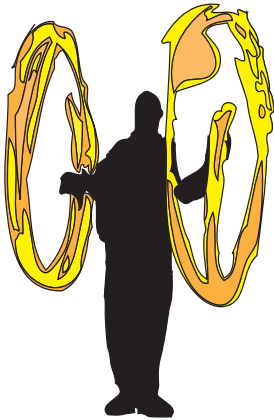
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
